So, I'll be reaching a whole new audience.**

**Got some amazing elk rut action at Mammoth Hot Springs in Yellowstone in September along with "the usual"- bison, pronghorn, deer, black bear, grizzlies and wolves.**

**Finally, a preview for next year. Below is a small study (9"x12") for what will be a quite large painting of elephants crossing the Ewaso Ngiro River, Samburu, Kenya. Hadn't done an elephant for awhile, needed to figure out the water and get some grasp of how the background would go. So far, so good.**
